Visual Arts at EKU?

The B.A. in Art at EKU can be taken with options in Teacher Education or Liberal Arts. The teaching degree, offered in partnership with the College of Education, qualifies students for teacher certification K-through-12 in Art. The two Liberal Arts options are intended to give students a general grounding in the studio arts, which they can combine with a related minor or electives to suit their intellectual or career objectives.

Along with the University's General Education requirements, all Art majors take a required 15-hour Foundations program in studio skills, visualization, and theory. This is followed by the Core curriculum, made up of fifteen hours of introductory studios and twelve hours in art history/criticism. Liberal Arts majors will also take an additional 12-15 hours in art along with their 22-25 hours of an outside minor or electives. Teaching majors will take an additional 37 hours in art and education courses, and meet the admission and completion requirements of the Teacher Education program (Department of Curriculum and Instruction).

Careers in Art

In the midst of education reform in Kentucky, good art teachers are in short supply, and Art majors who obtain certification will find many opportunities open to them across the Commonwealth and beyond. Successful Liberal Arts majors can choose from a wide range of graduate degree programs for the completion of their professional education, but will also find their skills in visual literacy and problem-solving in immediate demand by the information, entertainment, retail, or manufacturing industries, and both private and public arts and museum agencies.

Degree Programs

In addition to the above degree, the Department of Art & Design offers professional (B.F.A.) baccalaureate degree program options in the following studio arts: Ceramics, Graphic Design, Interior Design, Jewelry and Metals, Painting, Photography, Printmaking, and Sculpture. There are also minors in Studio Art, Art History, Art Teaching, and Interior Design.
